It seems impossible to believe that 20 years ago this month I was preparing to move to Enfield and assume the pastorate at EBC on November 1. It feels so long ago and also so recent. I was so young, just 26, and had not a clue how dramatically different the future would unfold from what I imagined. I have found myself wanting desperately to tell that young kid a few things recently to make life a little easier for him in the years ahead. I thought I would take the opportunity to share some of that list with you as it might help you on your journey, for these revelations have certainly changed the trajectory of mine over these last 20 years.

Dear Marc,

Welcome to Enfield! I know you are nervous and a little overwhelmed at the present, but that's ok it's the nature of the job. You will quickly learn what an amazing gift you have received to be called to this community of faith, one you will soon come to cherish as much as you do the one I/you currently serve. You will weep more when you leave here than you did two days ago when you left Chapel Hill. Your tenure will prove difficult at times, but in years to come you will awaken in the night thinking you are in Enfield and be sad when you realize you aren't. Treat each day ahead of you for what it is, a precious gift of God. And while I'm dispensing wisdom, here's a few other things to keep in mind.

- —Sunday you will be preaching on "One Sure Thing" from Job 19. Remember the surety of hope on those inevitable dark days that will occur in days to come.
- —Take care of yourself, it's a task no one but you can do. Remember also mental health is as important as physical health. Exercise more.
- —Recognize a function of grace is the ability to change your mind and is a sign of growth. Dead things do not grow, so see these changes as a sign of life and embrace them.
- -Realize your task is obedience and faithfulness, the rest is up to God and other's doing the same task in their lives.
- —Write more of your journey down, particularly concerning Roger, Larry and Wayne. Memories will fade, your in the moment reactions won't and will be a valuable testament of God's unfading faithfulness and your growth when the memories grow fuzzy.
- —Plan and take more trips even if it's by yourself. It will clear your mind and make you sharper.
- —Spend more time with Julius, James, Peggy Jo, Daddy, Bill, and particularly a guy you will meet next week named Allen. I won't tell you when, but they will be gone before you're ready and the ache of unasked questions never leaves.
- —Trust me, you will miss that organ one day.
- —And one last thing and this is important! You're going to meet this girl one Fall day in the next few years. She's cute, smart, and talks fast. Trust your instincts and don't delay proposing and setting a date. You'll thank me one day.
